Monday July 30 First part of this day began with strong breezes from the Southeast with rain and rough sea on Chul under two topsails and stay standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at noon we were round on Port tack, "Swift" in sight saw a lot school of porpoises, pump attended to
Lat 36° 55' Long 13° 24'

Tuesday July 31 First part of this day began with moderate breezes from the Southeast and foggy weather. Chul under foresails and stay standing to the windward on Port tack, at 3: P.M. were round on Starboard tack "Swift" in sight, and made the merchant vessel bound to the North, pump attended to Lat 36° 56' Long 13° 44'

Wednesday August 1 First part of this day began with light breezes from the Southeast and squally with rain all day at 10: A.M. we set main sail on Starboard tack, standing to the Eastward in company with "Swift" at 12: clock we in school of small whales we lower two boats (S Boat) struck a young Bull, and (C. Boat) the boatster dart the harpoons on small, but did not get fast, at 6: P.M. we take these Whales along side, and hoist boats up, and we put gear up all ready to cut in next morning, and we shorting sails, pump attended to no observation sun obscure

Thursday August 2 First part of this day began with light breezes from the Southeast and clear weather, at 5: P.M. we commence to cut in whales, at 11: A.M. we finish cut in, and we clear up the head, Chul under main sail and head sails standing to the Eastward on Starboard tack, at 4: P.M. breeze up strong we took in main sail, set main top sail, we put one short of new line

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on the S Boat, tub, "Swift" in sight at 4:30 P.M. we start the fire, at 6: P.M. were ship on Port tack, pump attended to
Lat 37° 05' Long 13° 44'

Friday August 3 First part of this day began with very light breezes from the Southeast, and clear weather, in morning we set main sails, and flying jib on Starboard tack, standing to the Eastward in company with "Swift", saw a lot of porpoises at 5: P.M. we finish boiling, at sun set we shorting sails and were ship on Port tack pump attended to
Lat 36° 41' Long 13° 45'

Saturday August 4 First part of this day began with light breezes from the Southwest and clear weather, in morning we set main sails, on Starboard tack standing to the South, in company with "Swift" we commence to stow the oil down at 8:30 we raised a school of small whales we lower two boats, we catch two one each Boat, "Swift" lower two Boats, but she did not catch any - we take three Whales along side at 2: P.M. and we put gear up and commence to cut in, at 3:30 at 6: P.M. we finish cut one, and we live one to next morning, we clear up the head, and shorting sails, pump attended to
Lat 36° 43' Long 13° 29' 40' 72.49

Sunday August 5 First part of this day began with fine breezes from the South West, and clear weather, in morning we set main sails, and commence to cut in whale, at 11: A.M. we finish cut in whale, and we were ship to the Westward at 1: P.M. we start fire, and we clear up the head, this day we pump out some fresh water, and stow some oil down, at sun set we took in main sails, and set main top sail, pump attended to
Lat 36° 52' Long 13° 16'
