Monday August 6 First part of this day began with fresh breezes from the South West, and clear weather, vessel under two try sails and head sail, boiling this day we pump out some fresh water, and stow some oil down, at noon we sighted the "Swift" to the leeward, at 2:30^{PM} she went out sight at 6: PM we were ship to the Southward - pump attended to Lat 36° 50' Long 73° 30'

Tuesday August 7 First part of this day began with light breezes from the Southwest, and clear weather in morning we set all sails on Starboard tack, standing to the South, in company with "Swift" at noon we were ship on Port tack, this day we stow down the oil, at 1: PM we raised a school of small Whales, going quick to the windward, they went out sight we did not lower the Boat, at 4: PM we finish stow down and wash the vessel in sight pump at sun down we took in main sail and flying jib pump attended to Lat 36° 48' Long 73° 32'

Wednesday August 8 First part of this began with fresh breezes from the Southwest and clear weather, vessel under fore sail, main try sails and head sails, on Port tack, at 8:30 AM we raised a school of small whales, we lower two Boats, and we catch two one each Boat we take these Whales along side at 3:30 PM and we put gears up, at 3:30 PM we commence cut in Whales at 7: PM we finish cut in and take gears down and shorting sails, and set watch pump attended to Lat 36° 48' Long 73° 32'

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Thursday August 9 First part of this day began with very light breezes from the Northeast, and clear weather, in morning we set main sails and flying jib, steering South on Port tack - at 8: AM in morning we start the fire, at 1: PM we raised a school of small Whales we lower two Boats the S. Boat struck a small whale, but he lost his harpoon strand, the whale went to the windward at 4:30 we take the Boats up, at sun set shorting sails pump attended to Lat 36° 45' Long 73° 22'

Friday August 10 First part of this day began with very light breezes from the Northeast and clear weather, vessel under main sails and head sails boiling, at 9: AM we raised a school of small Whales, we lower two Boats, both Boats struck and S. Boat loses his Whales, the line got foul with other Boat, and S. Boat catch a small whale we take these Whales along side at 10:30 AM and we put gears up and commence to cut in Whales at 2:30 PM we finish cut in and we take gears down and clear up the head, at sun set we shorting sails, pump attended to we stow some oil down, Lat 36° 44' Long 73° 29'

Saturday August 11 First part of this day began with strong breezes from the Southwest and rough sea, on vessel under two try sails and jib, steering to the windward on on Port tack at 8: AM we finish boiling, and we stow the oil down, and stow off the hole, saw a merchant vessel bound to the North, pump carefully attended, Lat 36° 37' Long 73° 27'

Boat hook, key, and line and hard board
