Sunday August 12 First part of this day began with strong West breeze and rough sea, on vessel under two try sails and fore try sails standing to the windward on Starboard tack at sun set were round on Port tack vessel shipping much water on deck, pump attended to
Lat 36° 50' Long 74° 40'

Monday August 13 First part of this day began with strong breeze from the Southwest and rain all fore noon, vessel under two try sails and fore try sails, at 1 P.M. the wind shifted to the Northwest, and moderate wind we set main sails, fore sails and head sails, standing to the South, at 5 P.M. began to rain, we shorting sails, pump attended to
Lat 36° 52' Long 74° 36'

Tuesday August 14 First part of this day began with fresh westerly wind, with squall vessel under fore sail main try sails and jib, standing to the South on Starboard tack at 10 A.M. we were round on Port tack, at 11 A.M. we raised a school of small whales, we lower two boats and a boat struck a young Bull at 4 P.M. we take these whale along side and we put gear up and commenced to cut in, at night we finish cut in whale, and we shorting sails pump attended to
Lat 36° 50' Long 73° 36'

Wednesday August 15 First part of this day began with light westerly breeze with squall and rain vessel under two try sails and fore try sails, latter part with dead calm, and clear weather, we start the fire, saw a steamer going to East, pump attended to
Lat 36° 50' Long 73° 17'

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Thursday August 16 First part of this day began with fresh breeze from the Southwest, with squall, vessel under two try sails and jib, on Starboard tack boiling, at 3 P.M. we finish boiling, and we stow some oil down we brokfast hard bread, pump carefully attended
Lat 37° 18' Long 73° 14'

Friday August 17 First part of this day began with strong Easterly wind and clear weather vessel under two try sails and jib, standing to the windward on Starboard tack, crew supplied stow down the oil, at 11 A.M. we finish stow down and we sleep up the vessel in side, saw three mist schooner round to Southwest pump attended to
Lat 38° 26' Long 73° 03'

Saturday August 18 First part of this day began with light breeze from the Southeast and clear weather, in morning we set main sails on, Starboard and tack standing N.E. for home, crew mended the vessel in sight saw a number of Steamer bound to South, pump attended to
Lat 39° 16' Long 72° 29'

Sunday August 19 First part of this day began with light breeze from the Southwest and clear weather, vessel under all sails set, steering N.E. for home, saw a number of merchant vessel bound to South, pump attended to
Lat 40° 18' Long 72° 04'

Monday August 20 First part of this day began with good breeze from the Southeast and clear weather vessel under all sails set steering N.E. to Block Island. pump attended to at 10 P.M. we sighted the Shipnook light
Lat 40° 00' Long 71° 00'
