Remarks on Board Monday December 28th 1863

This day commences with a gale from the
N^W W^W Coors S S W^W at 7 P M took in top
galentails double reefed the top sails
At 12 o'clock at night close reefed the
Main top sail furlled the fore and main
Top sails at 7 P M gale broke wind haled
to the N S W at 10 P M made sail
So ends this day Lat 41.57 S Long 55.02 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday December 29th 1863
First part of this day strong winds from
the N S W heading S at 7 P M wind
haled to the N S W very sea on head beat
Sea took in top galentails double reefed
The top sails blowing agale saw
plenty of birds saw fin backs so ends
this day Lat 44.28 S Long 56.27 W

Remarks on Board Wednesday December 30th 1863
This day commences with strong winds from the
W heading S S W saw several fin backs
At 7 P M saw a bark to the windward at 11 o'clock
Wore ship at 12 o'clock reefed the top sails
At 6 P M spoke bark Callao of New Bedford
16 months out 1300 lbs later part wind not
So strong caring top galentails so ends this day
Lat 45.43 S

Remarks on Board Thursday December 31th 1863
First part of this 24 hours strong wind with
pleasant weather head beat sea bearing to the in from
the S could not caring all sail later part
All sail set so ends this day
Lat 47.46 S Long 58.15 W

Remarks on Board Friday January 1st 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the
W heading S S W middle wind light later
part wind from the S heading N S W fresh
breeze all sail set one ship in site on plain
In braking out in the after hatch for Corn meal
So ends this day Lat 48.46 S Long 60.30 W

Remarks on Board Saturday January 2nd 1864
First part of this 24 hours strong wind from the S S W
heading W to S W wind vers and hols caring all sail
At 7 P M took in rails fore and main top galentails
Fly jib later part agale double reefed the top sails
So ends this day Lat 48.34 S Long 61.05 W

Remarks on Board Sunday January 3rd 1864
First part of this day strong wind from the S S W
caring double reefed top sails at 3 P M more
Woodard set hyl top sails heading W at 3 P M
Wind haled to the N S W heading to the S
All sail set 2 sails in site brig Margaret of
Kinoh had a head beat sea heading S E
So ends this day Lat 49.31 S Long 63.19 W

Remarks on Board Monday January 4th 1864
First part of this day strong wind from the S S W
heading S E 2 sails in site at 6 P M wind light
haled to the S heading E S E at 10 o'clock
Calm at 2 P M wind haled to the S W
heading S S E at 8 P M wind from the
W heading the Coors S by W saw plenty
of fin backs employed in braking out in the
after hatch between decks fresh breeze all sail
Set saw the Falkland Islands so ends this day
Lat 51.00 S Long 63.29 W
