This day commences with fresh breeze from the S.W. Steard in to the E saw no whals Steard in to the N.W. raised whals loward got one saw good money Ships steering N.E. so ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday June 23th

First part of this day strong wind from the S.W. finest cutting got the mach started the works saw Ships whaling to the E of our run of saw a dead whale Steard of it raised a live whale loward and got health of them got them long side blowed on brok out the fore back blowed so hard that we could not cut so ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday June 24th 1864

First part of this day blowing again thick fogg laying by 2 Whals impleid in hailing so ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday June 25th 1864

All this day blowing strong thick fogg impleid in cutting cut one whale so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday June 26th 1864

This day more moderate impleid in cutting And hailing thick fogg kep of N.E.

So ends this day

Remarks on Board Monday June 27th 1864

All this 24 hours thick fogg impleid in hailing Steering N.E. for the streets so ends this day Sat. Sunday

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 28th 1864

First part of this 24 hours thick fogg impleid in hailing Stowing the hoane down below In the after hatch got the cables up and bent them got the Stahard Anchor of the hoane. Sit up saw the land stud in to the land Most up to plumer bay saw 3rd sails working to the E wind E.S.E. so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 29th 1864

First part of this day wind from the E.S.E. Thick fogg with rain working to the N.E. later part lit up saw the land wind from the E.N.E. Impleid in hailing setting up shacks So ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday June 30th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the E.N.E. thick fogg with rain Impleid in hailing and Stowing down in the main hatch saw Saint Lorn's Island Steering N.E. by E in the streets saw 8 sails So ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday July 1st 1864

First part of this day light light wind from the E.S.E. heading in to the S saw the ice in to the N.E. of us thick fogg impleid in hailing And Stowing down in the main hatch stork Ship John P. West of New Bedford 2 Whals So ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday July 2nd 1864

All this 24 hours light winds from the E.N.E. Laying a back part of the time in the ice Impleid in hailing so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday July 3rd 1864

All this 24 hours impleid in hailing thick fogg most of the time Stork bark Washington of New Bedford saw plenty of deval fish saw the diermeads Island bearing N.N.W. wind wind N.W. working to the Westward so ends this day Sat. 65.14 N
