

Remarks on Board Monday July 4th 1864

First part of this 24 hours light wind from the NNE heading to the NW thick fog Implied in boiling and clearing out between decks braking out Shooks at 10 AM lit up saw East Cape bearing NNE Wind to the NW heading then the Struts so ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 5th 1864

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from the NW working thru the streets saw 2 barks working thru Implied in boiling Wind from the NW NW At 6 AM finest boiling at 3 PM saw East Cape

Tacked ship heading NNE strong wind took in top gale's sails saw 9 sails sum of them Running in to the streets at 10 AM saw Ice to the leeward later part heading W wind from the WNW so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 6th 1864

First part of this 24 hours strong wind from the W heading NNE thick fog saw Ice in patches Later part wind from the NNE heading W Saw several ships Implied in stowing down in the Main hatch Choked of the Main hatch Spork bark Oriole Bernegan 4 whals this cesen reports ships in the Arctic 15 of June seen no whals going out in to the streets reports the Henry kneeland sunk in the Ice so ends this day Lat Long

Remarks on Board Thursday July 7th 1864

First part of this 24 hours strong wind from the NNE heading to the W caring all sail At 5 PM got in to the Ice tacked ship heading NE Implied in stowing down in the main Fore hatch saw several sails steering of to the S so ends this day Long 170.30 W Lat 68.15 N

Remarks on Board Friday June 8th 1864

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from the NNE got up to the ice saw several ships Running of at 4 PM kept of SSE all sail Sat later part steering SE by E Implied in braking out for Shooks saw plenty of rip sacks So ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday July 9th 1864

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from the NW steering SE by E for the streets thick fog by Spels at 8 AM passed the diermass Spork bark Ontario 2 Whals so ends this day

First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from the NNE heading to the W thick fog later part Wind from the SSE steering NNE Clear in the streets natives comon board saw 9 sails So ends this day Lat 65.49 N Long 167.40 W

Remarks on Board Monday July 11th 1864

First part of this 24 hours Modest breeze from the SSE steering to the N for East Cape at 4 PM Spork ship general test of harner one whale this Season comin thick fog Spork ship Congress with 1 Whale board N whe want water middle And later part Calm laying of oir at East Cape Thick fog natives com on board so ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 12th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the N With thick fog of East Cape trying to get water lit up sent 15 cask a shower got 9 filed the Ice giv a way had to com on board blowing Gale of wind so ends this day

Remark on Board Wednesday July 13th 1864

All this 24 hours blowing agale from the NNE heading to the NNE caring double reefed top sail So ends this day
