

Remarks on Board Thursday 14th July 1864

First part of this day blowing agale from the N^W heading to the W^W Carrying hulltop sails Main top galeent sail rove a new cutting fall So ends this 24 hours Lat 67.19 N Long 167.58 W

Remarks on Board Friday 15th July 1864

First part of this day strong wind from the N^W heading to the W^W thick fog at 3 PM More ship heading N^E at 5 PM more ship heading W^W saw one sail at 10 PM Clear of all sail so ends this day Lat 68.14 N Long 172.04 W

Remarks on Board Saturday July 16th 1864

First part of this 24 hours light wind from the N^W heading to the W^W saw 4 sails made the ice stud up to it saw 2 low heads going N^W Ships working to the E^W when steard in to the N^W As far as we could go tackled ship heading to the E So ends this day Long 68.46 N Long 172.12 W

Remarks on Board Sunday July 17th 1864

First part of this day light are from the N^W heading in to the S^W at 6 PM spork bark Massachusetts Middle part Calm later part wind from the E^W Ice in to the north heavy saw plenty of Walrus 3 Sails in site so ends this day Lat 69.04 N Long 172.20 W

Remarks on Board Monday July 18th 1864

All this 24 hours light are from the E^W working to the E 5 Sails in site employed in braking out In the after hatch brok out a skew for sail And bent it so ends this day Lat 68.65 N Long

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 19th 1864

All this 24 hours light wind from the N^E heading E^W Spork Ship Hector of New Bedford 1 Whale 9 Sails in site so ends this day Lat 69.06 N Long 170.40 W

Remarks on Board Wednesday

July 20th 1864

First part of this 24 hours light wind from the N^E heading E^W thick fog at 7 PM saw ice At midnight clear saw several ships wind hoked to the E^W heading N^E saw heavy ice to the S^E saw a whale to the windard toward 3 boats Pulled to the wind ard but did not see him again So ends this day Lat 68.57 N Long 169.12 W

Remarks on Board Thursday July 21st 1864

First part of this 24 hours light wind from the N^E fine weather working to the E Middle and later part wind E^W saw 20 Sails saw the land bearing E N^E 20 miles of So ends this 24 hours Lat 69.01 N Long

Remarks on Board Friday July 22nd 1864

First part of this 24 hours light wind from the E^W working to the S^W Pacific of New Bedford Later part employed in getting water of the ice Saw several ships so ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday July 23rd 1864

First part of this 24 thick fog spork bark Mercury got that head of bone that we helped her get Later part wind from the E N^E Working to the N at 10 PM saw a whale toward 3 boats got most on to him lost run of him com on board steard in to the N saw saw several ships so ends this day Lat 69.06 N Long
