

Remarks on Board Sunday July 21st 1864

First part of this day light wind from the ENE
Working to the windward at 3 P.M. spoke bark
Pickman keel 5 whals middle part thick fog
Wind from the SSE later part rainey blowing
Strong carrying double reefed top sails starting
To the E saw several sails saw catard ice
So ends this day Lat 68.29 N Long 168.28 W

Remarks on Board Monday July 22nd 1864
This day commences with a gale from the SSE
heading SW carrying double reefed top sails
later part heading to the E carrying double reefed
Reefed top sails so ends this day Lat 69.08 N

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 23rd 1864
First part of this 24 hours agale from the SSE
Heading SW later part wind from the WNW
heading to the N carrying double reefed top sails
5 sails in site so ends this day
Lat 69.30 N Long 167.01 W

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 24th 1864
First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from the
SE working to the North west at 5 P.M. com
to the ice tacked ship at 7 saw a whale
Loward and chert went in to the ice com
on board worked to the SW to get round the
ice later part steared to the W long the
ice saw plenty of ships spoke ship
Fabius of New Bedford 2 whals so ends this day
Lat 69.47 N Long 162.59 W

Remarks on Board Thursday July 25th 1864
First part of this day fresh breeze from the NW
Working to the W com to ice at 9 P.M. part of
For the compass ground at 11 P.M. spoke ship
governor troupe and ship Aurora bound W
The went back N blowing agale from the WNW
Carrying double reefed top sails so ends this day
Lat 69.55 N Long 169.24 W

Remarks on Board Friday July 26th 1864

All this 24 hours Agale from the NW beating
To the windward Carrying double reefed top sails
hail Snow squalls Saw 4 ships to the leeward
So ends this day Lat 68.29 N Long 168.28 W

Remarks on Board Saturday 30th July 1864.
First part of this day agale from the WNW
beating to the windward 6 sails in site later part
More Modest All sail set cloudy with rain squalls
And Snow squalls so ends this day Lat 68.54 N Long 167.34

Remarks on Board Sunday July 31st 1864

This day commences with strong wind from the
WNW heading to the N at 6 P.M. wind holed
To the WNW tacked ship heading W at 11 P.M.
Com to ice had to steer of to the SW saw
Several ships ice heavy holed up to the W
So ends this day Lat 69.25 N Long

Remarks on Board Monday August 1st 1864
First part of this day fresh breeze from the NW
Saw several whals loward chert struck one
drowned from him saw one ship boiling
one cutting later part thick snow storm
Saw several ships so ends this day Lat

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 2nd

First part of this day fresh breeze from the
NW later part wind from the NE
With thick snow squalls 30 sails in site some
Whaling saw several boiling one cutting
So ends this day Lat 69.33 N Long

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 3rd 1864
First part of this day fresh breeze from the
NE saw 4 ships cutting whale cant sea whale
Tacking and filing round the ice later part wind from
The WNW 30 sails in site so ends this day
Lat 69.33 N Long 168.44 W
