First part of this day strong winds from the
W working to the W 30 Sails in site
Worked up to the Ice run of to the E then then
Worked to the NW so ends this day
Lat 69.33. N

Remarks on Board Friday August 5th 1864
This day Commences with fresh breeze from the
W up to the Ice middle part calm later part
Wind from the SE steard of W in to the Ice
Wind haled to the E blowing strong saw a whale
Landward did not see him againe com on board
Saw several going quick to the W in to the Ice
Several Sails in site working to the windard
So ends this day Lat 69.33 N Long 169.46 W

Remarks on Board Saturday August 6th 1864
First part of this day strong wind from the NE
Later part wind from the SE running to the WSW
2 Ships in company long the Ice ice heavy
Saw 10 sails Spork the bark Coral 1 whale
from the west working to the E so ends this day
With thick rainey Lat Long

Remarks on Board Sunday August 7th 1864
First part of this day light wind from the
SE heading to the SSW at 8 P M wind
Haled to the W heading to the E thick
later part strong wind heading to the windard
Saw several ships some going W some going E
So ends this day Lat Long

Remarks on Board Monday August 8th 1864
First part of this day blowing againe from the
N E working to the E saw several sails later
part light wind from the N heading WNW
Cloudy weather so ends this day
Lat Long

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 9th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the NW
Thick rainey heading to the W saw several Sails
Later part wind ENE heading to the wind ard
Clear 35 Sails in site Ice on whals so ends this
day Lat 70.08 Long

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 10th 1864
First part of this day light wind from the WNW
heading to the E NE later part fresh breeze
hick foggy haming with the Mercury raised whals
board struck and killed one took him long
Side 4 sails in site so ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday August 11th 1864
First part of this day fresh breeze from the N Implied
In cutting finesse cutting 1 PM later part wind
light running to the E started the works run to the
Mercury give the head of loan to her wat for
I dont know for Capt Hornan never send aboard
About 10 to me It was a good head 1500 lbs
Good so if whe come to whale for other ships
I think whe better gohom so ends this day
Lat Long

Remarks on Board Friday August 12th 1864
This day commences with light wind from the
SW run in show in 8 1/2 fathoms of water
Middle part wind from the NW heading WSW
Saw 10 sails saw 5 boiling saw several fish
Implied in boiling saw several pieces of Ice later
part wind from the WNW so ends this day
Lat Long

Remarks on Board Saturday August 13th 1864
First part of this day wind from the NW
Implied in boiling working to the N later part
Wind from the S steard in to the N E spork
Cape horn pigeon 2 whals thick foggy so ends
this day Lat Long
