

Remarks on Board Sunday August 14th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the N^E thick foggy saw ice Finest hoiling.
later part Calm Impleid in stowing down in the fore hatch stowed 114 lbs of oil so ends this day
Lat 70.40 N Long 161.38 W

Remarks on Board Monday August 15th 1864
First part of this day light are from the N^NW heading to the N^E at 5 P M had strong breeze from the N^NW running thru the ice
Pran ing to the land later part heading to the W
Saw 3 whals going to the S first so ends Lat 70.46 N Long 160.58

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 16th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the N^W heading W S W saildreds the sails heading to the E got out of the ice saw several whals going S W calm loward for them but could not get ngy them so ends this day Lat 70.35 N Long

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 17th
First part of this day Calm saw 2 whals loward for them but did not get ngy them
later part light breeze from the N^W steering S W saw 6 sails most of them going S W
So ends this day Lat 70.42 N Long

Remarks on Board Thursday August 18th 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N^W steering to the W S W thick foggy
later part clear saw 6 sails in to the S W one hoiling saw 2 whaling saw the ice to the N so ends this day Lat 70.18 N Long 166.45

Remarks on Board Friday August 19th 1864

This day commence with fresh breeze from the N^NE raised whals loward got a whale took him long side cut him in thick foggy
Started the works wind light so ends this day
Lat Long

Remarks on Board Saturday August 20th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the N^E thick foggy Impleid in hoiling middle part lit up
Saw several ships one hoiling working to the E
later part thick foggy so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday August 21th 1864

First part of this day light wind and Calm thick foggy Impleid in hoiling at 9 P M spoke bark Camilla of Newbedford hoiling her 7 whale working
to the windward finest hoiling saw 8 sails so ends
this day Lat Long

Remarks on Board Monday August 22th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the E S S heading to the N later part light wind from the E N E steering to the S W Impleid in stowing down in the after hatch
stowed 109 lbs of oil saw 7 sails all working
to the S W so ends this day
Lat 70.23 N Long

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 23th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the S S W heading to the W middle part thick foggy
later part lit up saw whals loward comin thick Agane whals going S W chast them in to the ice
Whar it was heavy saw 2 ships whaling so ends this
Day Lat Long

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 24th

First part of this day light wind from the S W thick foggy at 4 P M had fresh breeze from the S W blowed strong double reefed
the top sails tookin the mainsail and fore sail
At midnight tookin fore and misen top sails so ends
this day Lat 70.15 N Long
