

Remarks on Board Thursday August 25th

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N^W steering to the S^W long the ice Ontario in site caring all sail so ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday August 26th 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N^W heading to the W at 7 P M got up to the fleet of ships the had scarce quite good money whals later part blowing a Modart gale caring double reefed top sails Sculling thru the ice so ends this day
Lat 69.58 N Long

Remarks on Board Saturday August 27th 1864

First part of this day blowing agale from the N^W at 7 P M raised a whale loward com up under the boat struck him got sticky hold drowed from him thick and rainy weather And could saw 30 sails so ends this day
Lat 69.59 N Long

Remarks on Board Sunday August 28th 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N^W heading to the N^W saw plenty of ships later part wind from the S^W saw 3 whals loward once did not see the Whale again saw several ships whaling

So ends this day Lat 70.21 N Long 173.06 W

Remarks on Board Monday August 29th 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the S^W steering in to the N^W at 4 P M had a thick snow torn middle and later part blowing a gale from the N^W saw six sails and plenty of ice so ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 30th 1864

All this 24 hours Modart gale from the N^W laying two under Cloud reefed Main top sail standing Tack and tack saw 1 whale saw 12 sails so ends this day
Lat 70.26 N Long

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 31th 1864

First part of this day wind from the W blowing Agale from the W laying two later part wind from the E fine weather saw 2 whals loward Chast them with out such es saw 2 ships whaling So ends this day Lat Long

Remarks on Board Thursday September 1st 1864

First part of this day light air and clam Saw several ships later part strong breeze from the E heading to the S^W saw several whals going quick to the S^W as o ends this day
Lat 69.59 N

Remarks on Board Friday September 2nd 1864

First part of this 24 hours strong wind from the E at 4 P M saw the bark Coral fast to a Whale had one boat stove and the Capt got Capt sed lost 2 men who loward one boat picked the Capt up took him on board hour ship picked up the boat took her to the ship later part strong wind from the N^W thick with snow squels saw 2 ships boiling So ends this day Lat 70.14 N Long 172.70 W

Remarks on Board Saturday September 3rd 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the W saw 4 whale loward for him saw him once com on board Middle part Calm later part blowing a gale from the W with snow storm caring cloud reefed Day sails So ends this day
