

Remarks on Board Sunday September 4th 1864

All this day agale from the N^E laying two
thick snow storm saw 16 sails saw the ice
in to the E standing tack and ~~at~~ tack so ends
this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Monday September 5th 1864
First part of this 24 hours agale from the N^E
With thick snow storm "caring" clous reefed main
Top sail later part more modart sot double reefed
Top sails heading to the E at 8 AM spoke ship
Fabius gamet with her com to the ice more ship
heading to the N^W so ends this day Lat 69.45 N

Remarks on Board Tuesday September 6th 1864

First part of this fresh breeze from the N^E
heading to the N^W thick foggy squalls
Later part light wind and thick saw one
Whale later part run of to the W
So ends this day Lat 70.03 N Long 174.14

Remarks on Board Wednesday September 7th
First part of this day light wind with foggy
saw a whale loward chast but com in thick
did not sea him a game com on board later
part light are from the N^W saw 2 whales loward
for them did not get by them com on board
Steering to the E S E thru caberd ice
So ends this day Lat Long

Remarks on Board Thursday September 8th
First part of this day light wind from the
N^W E steering to the E S E thru the ice
At 8 AM Calm thick foggy at 5 AM
lit up at 6 AM got out of the ice in to
Clear water saw several ships steering
to the E saw several whales so ends this
day Lat 69.43 N

Remarks on Board Friday September 9th 1864

All this 24 hours agale with rain from the N^W
First part saw whals to ruged to lower for them
Caring clous reefed top sails saw 6 sails standing
Tack and tack so ends this day
Lat Long

Remarks on Board Saturday September 10th 1864
First part of this day agale from the N^W E thick rainey
Weather middle part wind light later part blowing
Agale from the S E heading E N E caring double
Reefed top sails and Coasts thick rainey saw 4 sails
heading to the E N E so ends this day Lat 69.41 N Long 169.26 W

Remarks on Board Sunday September 11th 1864

First part of this day blowing strong from the
S E steering N^W E all sail sot later part
Wind from N E heading N^W W all sail sot
Wind light present weather nothing in site
So ends this day Lat 71.02 N Long 165.58 W

Remarks on Board Monday September 12th 1864

First part of this day fresh breeze from the
N^W E heading N^W thick foggy com to the
ice more ship heading to the E with the main
yard a back at 6 lit up kep of to the W
Run til dark layed aback til day light
kep of W ~~run~~ til made the ice then
Steard to the S long the ice then hoked
to the E saw plenty of whals to ruged
to lower for them hent a new main top
Sails Shortend sail standing tack and tack
Saw plenty of whals so ends this day
Lat 71.00 N Long 169.21 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday September 13th
All this 24 hours blowing strong large sea on
later part saw whals loward but did not
Strick them heavy ice to the leward comin
thick snow squalls whe ar in a bit worked out
So ends this day Lat 71.02 N Long 169.09 W

Saw plenty of whals
