

Remarks on Board Monday Nov 28th 1864

First part of this day strads winds employed
In getting Casks from the shore and stowing
them and filling them with fresh water
put 2 barrels of bone on board ship dreading
290 lbs of bone got receipt for the oil
235 Packages whale oil gallons 35176
233 Packages Sperm oil 5001 Charles rice absent
So men in the port so ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday November 29th
All this day employed in breaking out in the fore peak
And getting the ship down by the stern leading
the head out carpenters getting theopper on
got some Casks of from the shore so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday Nov 30th
This day employed in stowing away casks in the
hole filling them with water had 6 men run
Way had 3 men to work from the shore
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday December 1st 1864
All this 24 hours fine weather employed in
stowing casks filling with water so ends
this day

Remarks on Board Friday Decem 2nd 1864

All this day employed in getting of Shocks and casks
From the shore stowing them away so ends

Remarks on Board Saturday Decem 3rd 1864
This day finest getting water and washed ship
had 6 men from the shore so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday Decem 4th
All this day strong wind from the S
with rain so ends this day

Remarks on Board Monday December 5th 1864

All this day ~~thick~~ rainy weather 3 men mising
holed ship of in to the Stream and got of 10 barrels
of potatoes some lumber got all ready for sea
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday December 6th 1864

First part of this day Wind from the S W with
rain got ready for sea got most of the crew
Aboard at 2 P M tugboat com and took us out
onward went out thick rainy weather so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday December 7th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the W
Surging of ash on at 4 P M Capt corner board
Left of to the E had 6 Men on Board
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday Dec 8th 1864

First part of this day light wind from the
W W Working out between warhar and mortoy
Later part wind from W N E heading E on one
Tack and N W on the other thick rain storm
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday December 9th 1864

All this 24 hours strong winds from the W N E
Stowing tack and tack and tack employed in
Ship's duty Chouse the waches fitting the boats
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday Dec 10th 1864

All this 24 hour fine weather with a strong
Wind from the W N E heading W W
employed in mending fore top galent sail
So ends this day Solt 23.00 W
