

Remarks on Board Thursday June 8th 1865

All this 24 hours fine pleasant weather
Wind from the S W 30 Sails in site no
Whals Implode in Boiling working to the
N E Ice heavy packed clous to gether
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday June 9th 1865

All this 24 hours light wind pleasant weather
Imploud in boiling steering to the E
45 sails in site several Boiling saw some whaling
Spork Ship Nassau of New Bedford nothing
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday June 10th

All this day fine weather Implode in boiling
At 10 P M raised whals toward 5 boats
Struck one got him cut him in saw
Several ships whaling cutting and boiling
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday June 11th

All this day fine weather wind from the
S W Implode in whaling struck one drowed
from him boiling saw 5 whals several
ships in site boiling so ends this day

Remarks on Board Monday June 12th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the
S W Clear Stearing in to the N E at 5 P M
Comin thick foggy Implode in boiling 30 sails in site
& boiling at 8 P M Ice closed to gether so we
could not stir at 12 o'clock lit up saw several
ships saw the land in site Cape Naudine bearing
N N W so ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 13th 1865

First part of this day light wind from S S W laying in the
Ice several ships in site & boiling land in site at 10 P M
Saw 4 whals Ice so close to gether could not lower a boat
Took in 1000 Sails made fast to a large cake of Ice
Imploud in boiling so ends this day
Lat 61.52 N

Remarks on Board Wednesday 14th June 1865

All this day fine weather finish boiling Implode in ~~boiling~~
Stowing down in the Main hatch no whals saw several ships
Boiling to the Southward stowed 154 lbs oil 25 left on
deck so ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday June 15th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the S Stearing
to the N W got in to clear water Steard to the
N several ships Stearing of passed Cape Thadus in catard
Ice saw one whale going N N E toward port did not see
him again so ends this day Lat 62 1'

Remarks on Board Friday June 16th 1865

First part of this day thick and rainy weather
Spork gunnertrape 2 whals spork John P West 2 whals
later part thick with rain so ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday June 17th 1865

First part of this day light winds thick with snow
Stearing to the E in catard Ice saw 3 sails & boiling
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday June 18th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the
W Stearing to the E N E Thick foggy by 2 P M
Saw 2 sails spork the bark Senmour 3 whals
So ends this day
