

Remarks on Board Sunday June 18th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the W
steering to the N E At 7 P M raised a dead whale
Took him long side commenced cutting at 9 thick
With snow and rain first cutting commences boiling
Saw 2 sails made all sail steard N E thick by spots
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Monday June 19th 1865

First part of this day wind from the W
N E later part wind from the E S E thick fog
Imploil in boiling So ends this day
Late Long W

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 20th 1865

First part of this day thick fog, wind E S E
N E at 4 P M got in to the land tacked ship
Imploil in boiling working to the E 4 P M raised a whale
that the Waters had his fast line toward chased him
got hold of one of the lower parted from him
Chast but could not get ny him again
So ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 21st 1865

First part of this day light winds thick fog heading
to the N E at 4 P M com in to ice tacked
Ship to the the N N W at 9 P M tacked ship
heading E finest boiling spark george howland

2 Whals So ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday June 22nd 1865

First part of this day light wind from the W N W
thick fog working to the E later part clear
Saw Corants Island in site in company with the George
Howland later part wind from the N N E heading
N W 2 sails in site so ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday June 23rd 1865

First part of this day light wind from the W N W
At 11 o'clock P M wind holed to the S Casers N
In company with the George howland went thro the
Ice at 12 o'clock lit up saw the deer meads Island
haring N E got past the Island com in to clear water
5 Ships in site going in to the Arctic so ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday June 24th 1865

First part of this day fresh breeze from the S steering
N by compass thick fog at 4 P M lit up saw the
deer meads Island and Cape East in the Arctic ocean
5 Sails in site later part thick fog wind from
S E Imploil in storming down stowed 55 lbs
So ends this day Late Long W

Remarks on Board Sunday June 25th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the N heading
to the W saw one bark boiling middle part thick
fog wind from the N W heading N N E
Caring all sail at 9 P M lit up saw 4 sails
Saw one har boats down so ends this day

Remarks on Board Monday June 26th 1865

First part of this day clear saw several seal fish
3 Sails in site Imploil in breaking out in the fore
Peak for pips shook to start water in so ends this

Late 67.33 N

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 27th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the W
raised a dead whale sent aboard after it nother
Ship sent aboard but whe got ther first took him
long side cut him in two one half of the bone
middle and later part fresh breeze from N N W
thick fog heading to the windard imploil in
boiling So ends this day
