

Remarks on Board Friday September 15th 1865

First part of this day blowing strong from the N.E. up to the ice. Coxed of the lower hole. Imploded in boiling. At 6 P.M. saw whals loward. Chast comin thick comin loward whals going of S.W. Steard of W.S.W. rased whals loward got one. Cut him in. So ends this day.
Lat 70.45

Remarks on Board Saturday Sep 16th

All this day strong winds from the N.E. later part S.E. Imploded in clearing away the head and boiling. 10 sails in site. 3 hailing.
So ends this day. Lat 71.09 N Long 164.30 W

Remarks on Board Sunday Sep 17th 1865

All this day fresh breeze from the S.E. Saw whals loward chast with out cukes. Saw 10 ships. Lary Suel from the S.W. Imploded in boiling. So ends this day. Lat 71.25 N

Remarks on Board Monday Sep 18th 1865

First part of this day fresh breeze from the S.E. Middle and later part blowing agale from the S.E. Lary Sea on. Imploded in boiling. Saw whals. Staining tack and tack. So ends this day.

Remarks on Board Tuesday Sep 19th 1865

First part of this day strong winds from the S.E. thick with rain. had to cut down to water for Casks. later part wind from the N.E. Imploded in stowing down in the after hatch. Betwen decks. Gaining with the bark. Mercury. So ends this day. No Lat.

Remarks on Board Wednesday Sep 20th 1865

First part of this day light winds from the N.E. Thick foggy with rain. later part clear wind from W.N.W. Steared to the E. tacked ship heading S. S.W. rased whals loward chast them going to the Windward part. So ends this day. See In Site.
Lat 70.45 N Long 161.37 W

Remarks on Board Thursday Sep 21th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the W.N.W. Later part wind from the S.W. heading to the Windward. Saw the ice and land. 6 sails in site to the windward. Started the work. stowed down. 46 lbs in the main hatch. So ends this day.
Lat 70.27 N Long 160.43 W

Remarks on Board Friday September 22th 1865

First part of this day fresh breeze from the S.W. heading to the windward. later part wind light. Stud. In to the ice. Saw whals loward chast with out cukes. So ends this day. Lat 70.50 N Long 162.37 W

Remarks on Board Saturday September 23th 1865

All this day blowing agale from the W.N.W. up to the ice. Saw whals loward. struck one. drowed from him. com on board. rased a nother loward. struck. kiled him. took him long side. cut him in. very. Could every thing covered with ice. 4 ships in site. Whaling did not get away. So ends this day.

Remarks on Board Sunday Sep 24th 1865

First part of this day blowing a gale from the W.N.W. middle and later part fine weather. No whals marked to the W. 4 ships in site. one boiling. So ends this day.
Lat 70.27 N Long 163.03
