Caring all sail employed in hoisting at night
Took in sail up to the ice at day light
Made sail saw Whals toward struck one
drowned from him saw the French ship take on
later part blowing strong so ends this day
No Sails No Log

Remarks on Board Tuesday Sep 26th 1865

First part of this day strong winds from the
N.W. E. saw a whale toward for him did not
see him a gale com on board had a man die
At 5 P.M. lured him Charles Cornacker
Bin Sick 2 months saw 2 ships 2 boiling
Spork John howland 15 Whals so ends this day
Sails 70.24 W Log

Remarks on Board Wednesday Sep 27th 1865

All this day blowing a gale from the N.W. E.
Caring clars reefed top sails fastest hoisting
Stowed down 123 lbs saw 2 whals going to the
Wind ard saw 3 sails so ends this day
Sails 70.38 W Log 166.20 W

Remarks on Board Thursday Sep 28th 1865

First part of this day blowing strong from the
N.W. E. up to the packed ice 3 ships in site
Saw them whaling saw whals toward struck
One run to the windard to the ice in the boat
Took the ice took the line lost him chase him
Til dark com on board so ends this day
Sails

Remarks on Board Friday Sep 29th 1865

All this day blowing a gale from the N.E. up to the
ice run of to the Southard 10 miles got out of the
ice saw no whals so ends this day
Sails 70.15 W Log 167 38 W

Remarks on Board Saturday Sep 30th 1865

First part of this day blowing a gale from the
N.E. ice in site middle part more moderate later
part wind light all sail set heading to the W
ice in site to the W gamed with the Minerva
9 Whals saw the Northern light steering of S.W.
Hd sail set saw the John howland so ends this
day Sails 70.07 W Log 169.04 W

Remarks on Board Sunday October 1st 1865

First part of this day light are from N.W. W.
Hnd Calm Middle part wind from the W with
Snow squalls later part wind from the N.W. W.
heading to the N.W. Minerva in company
had Snow squalls so ends this day
Sails 70.25 W Log 169.28 W

Remarks on Board Monday October 2nd 1865

All this 24 hours blowing a gale from the N.W. first
part of this day heading to the W later part
heading S.W. by W caring double reefed top sails
Saw one Boat-head so ends this day
Sails 70.27 W Log 170.08 W

Remarks on Board Tuesday October 3rd 1865

First part of this day blowing a gale from the
N.W. W. heading to the S.W. later part heading
to the W wind light with Snow squalls
Hd sail set so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday October 4th 1865

First part of this day light wind from the N.W. W.
heading to the North at 6 P.M. more ship heading
to the S.W. later part light wind from the
S and baffling round Calm gamed with the
Minerva so ends this day
No Sails No Log
