

Remarks on Board Saturday May 5th 1866

First part of this day fresh breeze from the S W Course W W by N. Thick fog by spells Middle part wind from the W W tacked ship heading to the S W later part wind from the N N E heading N W by W so ends this day
Lat 60.59 N Long 177.40 E

Remarks on Board Sunday May 6th 1866

First part of this day strong wind from the N E steering in for the land Cape Manern in site bearing N E distant 40 miles Middle and later part wind light and calm saw a little ice in shore so ends this day

Lat 61.39 N Long 178.55 E

Remarks on Board Monday May 7th 1866

First part of this day light wind from the N heading E N E Middle and later part strong wind double reefed the top sails took in jib and main sail worked up to the ice and land one sail in site so ends this day
Lat 62.09 N

Remarks on Board Tuesday May 8th 1866

First part of this day light wind from the North in 10 miles of Cape Thadars at 4 P M Spark gay head at 6 P M had strong wind from the N double reefed the top sails beating to the windward at 12 o'clock raised a bowhead low and 4 boats whale working to the W. gay head saw one two so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday May 9th 1866

All this 24 hours blowing strong from the N N E heading to the windward thru the ice at 12 o'clock raised bowhead low and did not see him a gay head got one She saw several in the ice in the after noon so ends this day
Lat 62.59 N

Remarks on Board Thursday May 10th 1866

All this 24 hours blowing a gale from the N N E Saw several whals low and twice for them so ended Could not see them out of the boat conceit the ice in site so ends this day

Remarks on Board Friday May 11th 1866

All this 24 hours blowing a gale with snow clouds reefed the top sails in the ice so ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday May 12th 1866

this day strong winds from the N N E working to the windward conceit the ice in site gay head in site so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday May 13th 1866

First part of this 24 hours strong wind from the N heading to the windward thick working thru the ice Saw the land so ends this day Lat 62.48 N

Remarks on Board Monday May 14th 1866

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N working thru the ice at 2 P M raised whale low and at 4 P M struck killed him got him long side at 9 P M thick fog got ready for cutting got thru cutting at 5 A M at 7 saw a whale low and lost run of him com a board thick fog Saw the gay head so ends this day Lat 62.42 N

Remarks on Board Tuesday May 15th 1866

First part of this day light wind from the N N Implied in boiling middle part wind from the S at 6 A M raised a whale low and 6 boats struck one and got him cut him in gay head in site whaling conceit the ice in site Saw the land bearing N S W so ends this day
