

Remarks Onboard Ship C Howland 1866
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N.E.
 lying in flower bay employed in boiling
 at 6 P.M. got under way and steered into
 the Straits middle part light air and calm
 employed in stowing down oil. Two sails
 in sight had several Native women
 onboard So ends this day

Saturday June 15th

Came with light air, latter part light
 air from the south employed in boiling
 at 12 M of Indian point
 the Niggers came onboard three sails in sight
 Lat 64.16 N

Remarks on Board Friday June 15th 1866
 First part of this day fresh breeze from S.E. lying
 in flower bay employed in boiling at 6 P.M.
 got under way hauled into the Straits middle part
 light air and calm employed in stowing down
 2 Sails in site had several natives on board
 So ends this day

Remarks on Board Saturday June 16th 1866
 First part of this day calm latter part light
 from the S in the Straits employed in boiling
 At 12 o'clock of Indian point Natives came on board
 Saw 3 Sails So ends this day
 Lat 64.16 N Long

Remarks on Board Sunday June 17th 1866
 First part of this day 24 hours fresh breeze from
 the S.E. of Indian point saw several boats
 going N. steered for Sant Lorn's bay had thick
 snow storm at 7 P.M. raised the land
 stood in to it tooked ship wind haled to the
 N.E. heaving to the windward saw 3 Sails
 So ends this day

Remarks on Board Monday June 18th 1866
 First part of this day strong wind from the N
 heaving to the windward of Sant Lorn's bay
 thick foggy and snow employed in boiling
 4 Sails in site working to the N saw several
 kipsacks had a man fall over board toward
 got him broke down the after davey to the
 standard boat So ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 19th 1866
 First part of this day blowing again from the
 North carrying double reefed top sails 2 P.M.
 Finest boiling thick foggy latter part clearing
 All sail heaving to the windward
 So ends this day
