Remarks on Board Tuesday July 3<sup>rd</sup>

First part of this day fresh breeze from S W later part light and calm saw whals chas them could not get my them 11 sails in site 2 boiling saw 1 cutting So ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 4<sup>th</sup> 1866

First part of this day light winds from the S working to the S W at 2 P M raised Whals toward 2 boats struck one got him long side at 5 o'clock cut him in made sail working to the S S W fresh breeze saw 4 ships boiling so ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday July 5<sup>th</sup> 1866

All this day blowing strong wind from the S Carrying double reefed top sails Implode in boiling Spork Ship gay head 5 whals so ends this day  
Lat 68 49 N

Remarks on Board Friday July 6<sup>th</sup> 1866

All this 24 hours blowing light from the S Implode in boiling Spork bark panney Clean saw ships in site so ends this day  
Lat 68.50 N Long

Remarks on Board Saturday July 7<sup>th</sup> 1866

First part of this day Strong winds from the S later part wind from the same light with foggy saw several ships so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday July 8<sup>th</sup> 1866

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N At 2 P M raised a whale toward pro him struck And drowed from him lost him so ends this day  
Lat 69 27 N

Remarks on Board Monday July 9<sup>th</sup> 1866

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N Stearing to the S E thick foggy by Speds Implode in boiling Stowing down in the after hatch so ends this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 10<sup>th</sup> 1866

First part of this day fresh breeze from the S Stearing of to the S E later part wind light thick foggy Implode in breaking out in the fore hatch slowing water so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 11<sup>th</sup>

All this day fresh breeze from the N E heading N N W thick foggy so ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday July 12<sup>th</sup> 1866

First part of this day fresh breeze from the N N W thick later part wind light Implode in smoking Ship up to the sea so ends this day  
Lat 69.50

First part of this day light wind and calm thick foggy at 7 P M clear raised a whale toward for him saw 3 ships cutting Saw several ships har their boats down so ends this day
