

Thursday Nov 18th

Moderate wind from S.W.

and fine weather, Standing upon opposite tacks by the wind, All sail set, 3 Sails in sight standing to the West by the wind, Heut. Sail them, weather them all, Saw Lumpers twice and gun off for them, Cooper making Molasses Kegs, Hooped off the old of Chamberis and gilled them up New fresh water, Broke out for the Calfish and got some out, Carpenter Sheathing the Storage Hatch, Officers stood mast head all day, Mr. Parker shaved out a Boat Mast, Put some oncois in nets.

Friday Nov 19th

Moderate wind from S.W. and

fine weather, Standing upon opposite tacks by the wind, All sail set, Saw 2 bargues steering to the N.E. and a brig standing to the West by the wind, her fore topgallant Mast gone, Saw another sail standing to the West, Carpenter Sheathing the Storage Hatch & finished sheathing the water ways rail, Cooper making Molasses Kegs, Lashed up the spars on the Larboard side the Deck, Employed on the rigging.

Saturday Nov 20th

Rising with light wind from

S.W. Heading N by E. All sail set, Saw 3 Sails, one steering to the N.E. Carpenter Sheathing the Comings of Storage hatch, Cooper making Molasses Kegs, I got out 300 pine Batings and nailed them on the spars that is lashed along the rails, Put on new chain royl back stays and a new head stay, Kitchens employed on the rigging & Knoting masts, A little part of the day calm, At 5 P.M. took a light breeze from S.E. Headed S.W. Lat by obs 14, 50

Sunday Decem 1st 1867

Light wind from S.E. and fine weather, Heading N by E & S.W. All sail set, In the morning bent the fore & Mizzen stays and set them, St. Barque made us steering to the N.W.E., Saw a Fishback,

Lat by obs 11, 49 Long W by Ch 30, 14

Monday Decem 2nd

First part of the day light wind from S.E., Heading from S.W. to W.S.W. Latter part of the day light wind from S.W. to S., Heading from S.W. to E.S.E. A big swell from S.W. by E. The wind is to the S.E. Not a grate hair to the S.E. of us, Saw a Ship steering to the West, Cooper making Molasses Kegs, Carpenter half sick, he made out to sheath the main hatch Comings, Watcher making Spun yarn and to work on the rigging.

Lat by obs 11, 19 Long W by Ch 30, 14

Tuesday Decem 3rd

Light wind from S.W. by N., Standing upon opposite tacks by the wind, Saw 2 Sails by the wind, - Saw an English Barque, steering for England, She was from Peru loaded with Goanna, We put letters on board of her, for home, Watcher employed on the rigging, making Spun yarn and a Swound that, Carpenter Sheathing the Comings of the fore hatch, Cooper making Molasses Kegs, I made 2 Shive Cloths and put them the Larboard & Starboard Forward Davits, to carry the falls clear the house.
