Saturday Jan 18th

Last night we had a nice breeze
from the NE & North, so we ran to the NW along
the land, At 11 at night passed Cape Horn, This mor-
ning we was against the Diegoes, then we took the
wind light from W by S, so we sailed to the NW &
we got off the Hatter rocks, Dried away Calm and thick-
ened up in the NW and looked like rain. We came up
with a large double topsail ship that was heading to
the West, Land about 15 miles off to the North and all along
from that quarter, High land white with snow, green
water

Sunday Jan 19th

Last night had light northerly
wind, Steered to the N.W. some, This morning breeze
up fresh from E. At 8 in the morning, A merchant
ship close by, Saw several large sperm whales,
Dismasted the boats, Mr Warren went on to a whale
Eye and dove the whale off, that started all the
whales, Finally the Mr Colston went on to a whale
& struck one, After several hours they killed
the whale and got the whale to the ship at 3 P.M.
got ready for cutting, & got dinner, then commenced
cutting & cut his head part off at 9 P.M. Rugged
cutting & the ship holes about bad, I got out much
water cutting with a chain around the whale

Lat 56, 18 Long West 70, 00

Monday Jan 20th

This day cleared a gale
from E by N. and rugged weather, At 3 in
the morning called all hands, got breakfast,
Jas Rugged for cutting, & we lost the whale day,
blowed on more heavy, At 11 with started 22 Chimes
and lost the whale, so we set sail & steered off
to the W & W in our course and set main top-
gallant sail, The whale tore off before Coffin & moved
the ship up some, Lost a head strap & part of 2
glue chains, The flower back every thing and got
things snug for bad weather, Thicker of fast & board boats

Lat by obs 56, 23 Long about 72, 00

Tuesday Jan 21st

This day had light wind from NE &
then hauled to the NE & breezed up a little, Fine pleasant
weather & if we had not parted from our whale we should
had a good time to cut the whale, He bailed out about
3 lbs of the blubber that we saved from the whale, Saw
grampises, Steering N.W. Carrying all sail

Lat by obs 56, 10 Long W by Ch 75, 51.

Wednesday Jan 22nd

Fresh breeze from E and hauled to S in
the course of the day, Steering N.W. Carrying all sail
Heavy swell from N. Saw a Finback, & Porpoises,
Blue Yachts, Shooked the Caboose cover and made a flat
form to stand on in sailing, Weathered the fore hatches
the Peter getting out boat masts, I cut a lug boat sail
for my boat

Lat by obs 54, 16 Long W by Ch 79, 23

We are now up to where we was at this time last
