

Saturday Feb 29th

Last night strong gales off the land, laid off and on through the night, carrying close reefed topsails, At 10 AM wind moderated and then the sea breeze set in so we came in to anchor in 8 fathoms water and paid out all the chain, then blowed on again off the land very heavy, sent down the royal yards & shacks on one side the gulland rigging, and braced up the yards sharp At 2 PM moderated and then the sea breeze came in again strong, the Schooner in here to anchor, repaired the royal I went on shore and brought aboard 92 lbs beef & 2 lbs of potatoes, there is very little fresh water in the hold, Capt of the Schooner came aboard of us for a key for his anchor shackle, so we made him a part of the iron hooker, I told my officers to stand night watches while in here

Sunday Feb March 1st

Land wind through the night and a sea breeze through the day, Starboard watch went aboard on liberty, Capt Balcock came in here Master of Schooner Anna, he came aboard and spent the afternoon with me, Capt Balcock tells me that the ship Onward is at Hilo, also the gayhead, 2 Schooners in here and another coming in

Monday March 2nd

Sea breeze through the day and land breeze through the night, All hands employed in breaking out meat & cofering meat, landed 64 lbs meat, repaired the main royal, dried some tawlines, got a quarter of beef, I put a letter aboard the Anna Capt Balcock for Capt Pulver to let him know about his anchor, the

Anna left here to day for Hilo with

Mr Conway's Children, The Schooner Flying Dart, Capt Cole took aboard Balcock for Oahita at \$10, ahead, Sheep \$1.75

Tuesday March 3rd

Sea breeze through the day & land breeze through the night, Lightered a shore meat and made up 113 lbs 23 of beef & 90 of pork took on shore some bread & some flour & some 300 lbs of shooks, Schooner Flying Dart got under way & went to sea with cattle & sheep for Hahale Capt Coal & Mr Basto, I spent part of the day on shore

Wednesday March 4th

Land breeze through the night and sea breeze through the day, Broke out the shore house on shore and stored in our meat, 113 lbs, got on shore some shooks, 6 Cask of meat, 2 Cask of flour, 1 Henty of Vinegar, 2 Cask of tawline, 1 Cask of soap, Ship Jayhead came in to anchor for potatoes, 130 lbs of beef fish, California, onward, Lidy at Hilo,

Thursday March 5th

Land breeze through the night and sea breeze through the day, Employed in breaking out shooks and landing them, took aboard 3 bbls of potatoes & 115 lbs beef, the Honolulu Steamer came in here for freight, two bargues off here coming in, 5 sheep on Kakaemoo Bay, Capt Kelly & my self went in to the gulch gunning for pigeons, I got 11 & Capt Kelly got 30
