Strong gale from W to NW

Heading NW. W. to NW. Carrying Double Reefed & Close reefed topsails, Rugged weather. Killed an bullock, for the feed was all gone, Cool weather and an old Swell from NW. A big Swell,

Monday March 30th

Strong Wind from NW by W and Squally and Cold rugged weather, heading NW. E. Carrying reefed topsails, tore the mainsail last night, Unbent the main sail & repaired it, Then ruptured him self when we left floor and I called him out to stand a watch this morning, He has been below all the time, Black Smith ruptured him self last night in the main yard, made preparations to put up the Cabin Stove

Tuesday March 31st Last night Moderate

Wind from NW. heading from NW by E to NW. E. Carrying whole topsails, This morning the wind died and breezed off from SW with heavy fog and rain all day, Steering NW. Carrying Chain top gallant Sail & Fly Sails, Boat Stoves grinding Hong & lances, Cooper & Carpenter joining the zebra for the stove pipe and Galvanizing the stove, Carpenters joined the doors to the fore Castle gang way

at 9 PM

Lat about 42, 27 Long about 69, 10 West

Wednesday March April 1st

Last night Strong Strong

wind from NW. heading NW. E. Carrying reefed topsails, Through the day fresh breeze from NW and clear weather, heading NW. E. All sail set, Employed in breaking out Stoves and selling them to the Navy, & Bata Coiled a new whale line, Clewed up the main topsail and sewed on a green patch, at 5 PM Calm and prospect of the wind haul to the S. W., Our Cabin Stove Draws very well

Thursday April 2nd

Last night the wind blew up from SE with a Rain storm, Steered NW by W. Carrying all sail, In the morning the wind hauled to SE and blew on and thick rain, Came down to reefed topsails, Water Cold, During the fore noon wind hauled to NW and cleared of & came up squally, heading NW. W. to S. W. by W., for the Lib Stone
