

Monday June 29th

Moderate wind from East Yogg
Most the time At 9 AM spoke the Concorda and Capt
Lopez & Capt Wood came aboard and spent the day. At
1 PM we anchored in 33 fathoms of water & the 2 other
ships anchored close by. East Cape bearing S by W dist 25 miles
At 9 PM fog cleared up and saw few tracks of ice. Anchored
with the 100 lb anchor of Bay Chane

Tuesday June 30th

In the morning we took a light
breeze from ESE and we took the anchor and stood in for
East Cape, California & Concorda in company. Headed to
East Cape, then 3 Canoes came along side of us. They had
been off a whaling and seen 2 bowheads going along
shore. We spoke the Concorda and then in one mile of
the low land to the NW of East Cape and anchored in 15 fathoms
of water. Muddy bottom and strong current setting NW and
scattering ice. I went aboard the Concorda. Saw the Calaver-
na coming in here and saw 2 ships off in the distance standing
to the south. Muddy bottom

Lat N 68, 15

Wednesday July 1st

Fresh breeze from SE and thick fog in
the morning. At 8 AM saw the ice coming down. Took
the anchor and run to the first bluff to the NW of East Cape
and anchored one mile off the bluff. 15 fathoms water and
slate bottom. Turn in sight of plenty of Canoes came to
the ship with loads of whale bone to trade. California &
Concorda anchored there. Hoisted the sails

Thursday July 2nd

Moderate wind from SE and fine weather. At
6 in the morning got under way from the bluff first to the
NW of Cape East and then to the NW along shore and then to
a little west along shore in each valley. We stopped to anchor

Steward got Drunk

Settle went and traded some. I spent the day

onboard the Concorda. Capt Wood and Capt Moore came
onboard the Concorda. We are working towards Cape
Lopez. Saw a dozen ships and one ship a sailing.
We are half way between Cape Lopez & Cape East.
Steward got drunk on rum he told while I was
away from the ship & was passing to the Potter and
Mr Potter liked the Steward

Friday July 3rd

Fresh breeze from NW and fine weather.
Standing to the NE by E under all sail. Saw a boathead
in the morning going NW along the land. Saw 4 small fish
going SE and the Navy's boats chasing them. At 1 PM Capt
Lopez & Capt Wood came aboard. The Corinthian came
down to us and we all went onboard the Corinthian and
spent the afternoon. Massachusetts stood to the SE of us
and the Frisco Massachusetts run to the SE

Lat by day 67, 00 Long about 172, 00 West

Saturday July 4th

Strong wind from NW and a thick
fog all day. We are well over on the East Shore. Rounded
several times and got from 25 to 30 fathoms of water. Saw
a whale bird and some ducks and 2 big sticks of wood. Kept
the topsails and laid aback upon opposite tacks. Lost the run
of the Calaverna and the Corinthian. Concorda close
by and spoke her once

Lat about 67, 00 Long about 168, 30

Sunday July 5th

Light wind from NW to NW and fine
weather. Beating to the NE, a big body of young ice to
the E of us and plenty of walrus. Saw the Corinthian
walrus all day. We saw 2 bowheads still on the water
& saw no more of them. Rounded the boats 2 times for bowheads
