

Spoke the Concorda, she saw one Bowhead, all
leading off for the ice, saw Killers, Devil fish, & a
Finback

Monday July 6th

Lat by obs 67° 18' Long by Ch 167° 20'

Moderate wind from N.W. to N.E. and fine
clear weather, in the morning set all sail and beat to the
N., Land in sight to the N.E. and ice along the shore, saw
several Devil fish. At 4 P.M. I went aboard the California,
Corinthian and Concorda in sight, killed a Dead Walrus.

Lat by obs 67° 44' Long by Ch 168° 41'

Tuesday July 7th

Light wind from S.W. to W.S.W. and fine weather, till
4 P.M. then came in some foggy, beating to the N.W. along the ice.
At 10 A.M. I went aboard the Concorda, Capt. Hallman from
Coast Discharge, & Capt. Wood & Capt. Lewis was there. The Discharge is
from the Company ground and then from East Cape, Capt. Salomon saw
2 Bowheads in that fog, 30 N. of Long about 68° 30' was one whale breaching
& I shall look for the whale, I am in hope to get around
to the N. of this ice and get on to the land north of Kent Harbor, for water,
Very strong current here.

Lat by obs 68° 05' Long about 168° 30'

Wednesday July 8th

Moderate wind from S. to S.E., the first
part of this day thick fog, laying black upon opposite
sides, California close by. At 1 P.M. Capt. Wood came aboard
a short time and at 2 P.M. the fog cleared off, Discharge &
Concorda in sight, I clattering ice all around to the north,
set sail and stood to the N.W. through thin ice, saw
several fish, sounded 30 fathoms of water.

Lat by acct 68° 20' Long by Ch 168° 13'

Thursday July 9th

Strong wind from S.E. and a thick
fog all day, standing upon opposite sides, Landed
part of this day killed the topkails, saw ice in the morn-
ing, I went aboard the California at night and
killed Capt. Taber there, Capt. Taber is from the same ship
in the Snader Sea, saw the Whales there & plenty of ice,
several ships went there from here the last of June.

Friday July 10th

Fresh breeze from S.E. and fine weather, in
the morning we ran off to the N.W. along the ice, saw several
ships, At 9 A.M. spoke the onward & Hagerman &
Harschank, Capt. Tulver & Capt. Haring there came aboard
and spent part of the day, they have 50 blk of Walrus and
a Devil fish, At 1 P.M. saw a lot of walrus & saw
the boats and caught 9 and lost them.

Lat by obs 68° 44' Long by Ch 170° 22'

Saturday July 11th

Strong wind from S.E. and hazy weather,
in the morning we ran off to the N. along side of ice to the
East of us and came to a clear sea to the East of us, so
we hauled up E.N.E. by the wind and found a clear sea.
At 12 A.M. came to a strip of ice and bore ship and killed,
and Capt. Dawden came aboard and then we went aboard the
Onward & Capt. Norton came aboard, I hope to get to Cape
Lisburn after this blow.
