

Shore for to enter my ship and get my letters
and returned with the crew letters at 3:30
P.M. gave the crew liberty money and let
them go a shore for the night

Sunday Nov 11th

Calm and fine warm water, Most of
the crew on liberty on shore

Monday December 18th 1868

Monday Decem 18th

Fresh trades from S.E. and
fine warm, Ship laying off end on Honolulu
At 4 P.M. I came on board with a shore boat
and Mr White Sides, George O. Williams and
John Hoblett came on board with me, Brace
forward and stood for Towaihee, 38 Men on
board all told

Tuesday Decem 19th

Strong gales from S.E. and clear
water, Some times heading S.E. along the land
and some times heading S.W. First part of this
day carrying all sail, latter part carrying topsails
only, We are now standing a cross the weather
Passage and Kugged, All by her in light, raised
wrecklines

Wednesday Decem 30th

Headed in to Towaihee Bay and
had light wind from the S. First part of the
day latter part strong gales from S.E. Blew
heavy through the night, carrying close reefed
topsails, heavy sea in the forenoon, set up the
main rigging and Carpenter put lights in the
stye light of the cabin

Thursday Decem 31st

Heavy gale from S.E. and
very squally, carrying close reefed topsails,
In the morning we run in for anchorage, and
looked the wind from S.W. and run in to anchor
at 10 A.M. Went a shore with 2 boats to get
down the provisions, At 12 M. came in to blow
