

Saturday April 3<sup>d</sup> 1867

Last night blowed on to a heavy gale from S.E. and a thick snow storm, this morning blowed heavy and moderated at 2 PM and breeze up from S and broke away. Set sail and steered N.E. by E. Last night headed E.N.E. and carried sail part of the night, Martingale unhooked, See Haglets.

Lat by obs 49, 55 N Long E by Ch 159, 50

Sunday April 4<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from South, steered N.E. by E through the night & carried reefed topsails, thick snow squalls, in the morning steered off N.E. a while, saw that the Martingale in its place, then we steered E.S.E. Set all sail, big swell from South and a rough sea snow squalls, saw a timber, See Haglets.

Lat by obs 51, 48 Long E by Ch 164, 15

Monday April 5<sup>th</sup>

Last night fresh breeze from S and snow squalls, steering E.S.E., carrying all sail, at 8 in the morning steered N.E. by E, wind hauled to S.E. by E, clear at times and at times thick snow squalls, the Southerly swell set the ship off to the North, broke out for provisions & whale lines, repaired the fore gaffard sail, Carpentered burking on the gaffard fore castle, Cooper making a kid, 3 men off duty sick.

Lat by obs N 53, 17 Long E by Ch 168, 48

Tuesday April 6<sup>th</sup>

Eight wind from S.E. to N.E. heading to the N.E. first part of the day, middle part heading N.W. Latter part heading E by N, thin clear weather, Carried whale lines, Carpenter finished the gaffard fore castle, Cooper making a grind stone brought, Set the men have whale, killed 2.

Lat by obs N 54, 11 Long E by Ch 168, 45

Wednesday April 7<sup>th</sup>

Light wind from the N.E. and fine weather, Standing upon opposite tack, All sail set, repaired an old Main Top sail, Cooper made a grind stone tub, Balled up some new spungers.

Lat by obs 53, 00 Long E by Ch 170, 24

Thursday April 8<sup>th</sup>

Blowing on strong gale from N.E. by N, At 8 last night tacked ship and headed E by S carrying all sail in the morning headed East and blowing on carrying whole topsails, Clear weather, At 12 headed E by N, Kept the topsails & took in the 4 spankers, Headed up E.S.E. At 2 PM came in a thick snow storm.

At 4 PM Lat by obs 53, 00 Long E by Ch 173, 10

Friday April 9<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from E.S.E. and cloudy some rain, heading N.W. carrying whole topsails, saw nothing but few birds, sea rough, Had hot tea for dinner.

Lat by obs 56, 00

Saturday April 10<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from N.E. and rigged weather, heading N.W. carrying reefed topsails & courses, shot sail through the night, Withed cold and cloudy most the time.

Lat by obs 57, 40 Long E by Ch 176, 04

Sunday April 11<sup>th</sup>

Strong wind from N.E. by N and cloudy some squalls, heading E by S carrying whole topsails, heavy cold sea making on the bow & on deck, Tied the 4 spankers, Chased some ones.
