

Thursday March 24th

Last Night Strong breeze from land and Sea breeze through the day. Hove up one of the anchors and cleared the Channel, got off 36 bbls of Potatoes. The Ship *Champion* came in here & Capt. Ayre came on shore and left his ship out sides. Took a quarter of Beef.

Friday March 25th Strong land wind and a fresh Sea breeze. 9 Ships laying at Pownahe for Potatoes. We took aboard 25 bbls of Potatoes, Capt. Ayre came on shore from Willemsoek and I spent the evening with him and Capt. Jones on shore. Took a quarter of Beef. This night we left for Honolulu.

Saturday March 26th Strong Day. Strong land wind and good weather. Took aboard 54 bbls of Potatoes & 12 Sheep and at 5 PM took the anchor and steered off to the West for Honolulu. Took Mr. Williams from Capt. Ayre's ship to carry him to Honolulu.

Saturday March 26th Moderate wind from NE and steering for Honolulu, but calmed under the lee of the Islands. Killed a Sheep, hope to be at Honolulu in the morning.

Sunday March 27th

In the morning I went on shore at Honolulu with a boat's crew and sent the boat off to the ship. I got my letters and answered them, then went to the sailors' home & got supper & slept all night.

Ship laid off & on, Mr. Whitney went ashore

with me,

Monday March 28th

Fresh. Breeze and cloudy weather. Ship laying off & on. At 12 M 2 boats came in shore and took off the log and things & at 4 PM I got through my business and the boat came in & took me off to the ship and we steered off for Honolulu and set all sail, all hands on board.

Tuesday March 29th

Strong wind from NE and a big swell rolling in. At 18 this morning we anchored in the gathering of water at Hana. The *Roman* & *Alvin* came left here this morning. I went on shore, got off 9 large Casks of water and 6 Cords of wood.

Wednesday March 30th

Strong wind from NE and a heavy swell leaving in. A heavy shower of rain got off 3 boat loads of wood and 9 large Casks of water. Bought 18 Cords of wood, they are small Cords and better for cooking. Entered and cleared my ship. Took on shore 2 bbls of oil for trading and left them on shore over night. The weather is too rugged for work and our boats.

Thursday March 31st 1870

Strong gales from NE and rugged weather. Took aboard 2 boat loads of wood, 1 load of cane tops, 5 Bullocks & per bullock, 45 fowl, 10 turkeys & 4 egg eggs, 2 bags of onions, 15 bbls Lima Potatoes at \$1.50, & Rice. At 5 PM sailed up Bala and we took the anchor & worked off to the West. Fresh water running down strong out of the gulch.
