

Tuesday July 19th Fresh breeze from N and fine thick foggy, kept the topsails, stood in to the ice and saw plenty of Walrus on the ice, lowered the boats and got in too much fog for Walrusing, Kiberna and Manerva close by, fired a big gun for the boats, Mr Potter struck the 4th Walrus (the Kibone) Employed in taking the blubber off the skin.

Lat about 67° 12'

Wednesday July 20th

Light wind from N.W. and fine weather, in the morning the fog cleared off and sent off 5 boats and caught 33 Walrus up to 3 PM and then sent the boats off for more Walrus, 3 ships Encompassing, saw the largest show of Walrus that we have seen the season, we are about 20 miles off the land, land plain in sight, to the S.W. and we are on the most Southern ice and the most Southern ships; the ships are in sight to the North, saw plenty of Killers, Kiberna encompassing, I was taken with distress in my Kibones and Chumliam in my Kibone.

Lat 66° 52' by obs

Thursday July 21st

Fresh wind from N.W. and a big swell, in the morning the fog lifted, saw no Walrus, so we ran to the South along the ice, at noon came to plenty of Walrus on the ice and ice packed, sent our boats in in company with the Kiberna's boats & drove the Walrus off the ice & out of the pack, so the boats caught some a piece in the water, saw Killers kill a walrus & a calf, land 15 miles off, we are South of Cape Gerde, 7 ships in sight to the North.

Friday July 22nd

Fresh breeze from South and fine clear weather, in the morning sent in 5 boats Walrusing and we chased all day, running off to the West along the ice, Kiberna & Manerva in sight Encompassing, chasing Walrus, about 12 ships in sight, in the morning land 10 miles off.

Lat by obs 66° 44'

Saturday July 23rd

Fresh breeze from S.E. to S.W. and fine weather, sent off all 5 boats in the morning and returned at night with 41 Walrus, saw plenty of Walrus, later in the day, about 20 ships to the North of us in sight, land in sight, Kiberna in company, Lat by obs 67° 10'

Sunday July 24th

Light wind from South and fine weather, went to the South and came to plenty of Walrus, Kiberna in company, 25 ships in sight to the North, in the morning sent off all the boats & Walrusing & 4 boats caught 40 Walrus and another boat to come, sea breeze in sight to the South of us, we have now onboard 910 Walrus, saw a big show of Walrus to day, land in sight.

Lat by obs 67° 09' N

Monday July 25th

Begins with a wind from N.E. & 4 or 5 ships came down to us and spoilt the Walrusing for a while, the Walrus moved South, we sent off all 5 boats in the morning and got 12 Walrus in all day, land in sight, we have now 930 Walrus & the ship is up heavy, saw a good show of Walrus, land in sight to the S.W.

Lat by obs 67° 07' N
