 Course Winds Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 22 1834
 S.W. 1835 Commences with moderate
 breeze saw nothing at 6 AM
 and the weather all sail set

Middle part of the same
 at 5 AM 6 ship in sight
 one sailing and one cutting

Later part light rain at 10 AM
 spoke the ship Ontario of Sag.
 Harbor one wrought and one
 sperm whale to end this day
 one ship in sight

Remarks on board Thursday Oct 23
 Commences with moderate
 breeze saw two whales going
 quick to the N.W. observed one
 and got fast at 5 AM saw hump back
 at 6 AM took in sail two ships
 in sight heading to the S.E.

Middle part strong breeze
 at 5 AM called all hands and
 made sail two sail in sight

Later part the same saw
 hump backs to end this
 day steering to the S.E.

Atlantic Ocean for whales Wilmet Luce Master 1834
 Wind Remarks on board Friday Oct 24
 N.W. 8 Commences with moderate breeze
 N.E. 838 saw for back 2 sail in sight
 at 4 AM took in sail 1 ship in sight

Middle part calm
 at 5 AM called all hands
 and made sail

Later part light air spoke
 the ship Miles of Warren with
 3 whales to end this day saw
 fin backs

Lat 33° 18'
 Long 9.50

Wind Remarks on board Saturday Oct 25
 N.W. Commences with pleasant breeze
 at 3 AM saw whales lower
 got fast killing him and took
 him to the ship at 5 AM commenced
 cutting at 8 AM finished and took
 in sail

Middle part fresh breeze
 at 5 AM set the top sail two sail
 in sight saw two whales going
 quick to the N.W.

Later part rising spoke the ship
 South Carolina of Dartmouth
 with 120 tons of sperm oil
 to end this day fresh breeze
