Remarks on board Sunday Oct 26th 1834

Commenced with fresh breeze
and clear weather commenced
hoisting four ships in sight saw
five whales at 6 AM took in sail

Middle part moderate breeze
and a heavy swell. Sailed with
the main by day at about 10 AM to
the N. E.
at 6 AM put double reef to sails

Latter part strong breeze and a
heavy swell. Sailed in sight saw
one whale going quickly to wind
ward. Day all hands employed in
hoisting

Remarks on board Monday Oct 27th 1834

Commenced with fresh breeze
at 4 AM saw whale. Hoisted cork
and got fast at 4 PM took in
sail several whales in sight
one ship cutting

Middle part moderate
at 3 AM finished hoisting
and closed the decks &c.
at 5 AM made sail 4 ships in sight

Latter part light air all hands
employed in breaking out the
main hatchway wind this day
saw plenty of whales could not
get fast one ship in sight looking
to end this day

Remarks on board Tuesday Oct 28th 1834

Commenced with light air and
some fog all hands employed
in hoisting plenty of whales
to wind for the deck to catch
at 4 AM took in all sail

Middle part rainy
at day light put double reef to
sails and commenced
stowing down

Latter part moderate and
foggy finish stowing down
at about the deck so end this
day saw whales could not get
fast 4 ships in sight 1 looking

Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 29th 1834

Commenced with strong wind
and fog at 3 AM took in sail
saw several whales to suggest to
board

Middle part more moderate
at 6 AM made sail clear
at 9 AM the ship saw 1 whale
this person

in clearing down saw
one whale so end this day
4 ships in sight
