

Ship Courier of Dorchester from Boston, cruising in the

Winds N.W. Remarks on board Thursday Oct 18th 1834
Commenced with fresh breeze and 2 par. whales
topped and got fast and
killed at 5 AM. then
to the ship and commenced
cutting found him to be
a grey skin, took in the
head and cut him away
took in sail

N Middle part strong wind
at 5 AM and double reefed
top sails on ship in sight

N.W. 3/4 S Latter part strong gales and
heavy squalls took in top sails
and several whales were
seen this day

Lat of 33 31
Long of 68 10

Winds N.W. Remarks on board Friday Oct 19th 1834
Commenced with heavy gales
and clear weather on the fore
sail and turned up the fore
at 4 PM was ship and heaved
to the S.

Middle part the same

W Latter part more moderate
and squally and double reefed top
sails and whales were seen
not get fast seen this day

Lat of 33 35
Long of 68 10

South Atlantic Ocean for whales Willard Luce Master 1834

Winds W. Remarks on board Saturday Nov 17 1834
Commenced with strong gales
took in the top sails at 5 PM
spoke the ship Abigail with
3 whales reported ship Enverall
with 4 whales at dusk took in the
fore sail

Middle part the same
at 5 AM more moderate and
double reefed top sails

Latter part fine weather
more sail spoke the ship Hope
with 2 whales saw plenty of
whales, could not get fast so
and this day 1st ship in sight & taking

Lat of 32 50
Long of 68 30

Winds S.W. Remarks on board Sunday Nov 20 1834
Commenced with fine weather
plenty of ship and whales in
sight whales if will that
they are worth catching them
at dusk took up the fore
and took in sail calm

Middle part calm at 5 AM
called all hands and made sail

Latter part the same
no ship in sight saw no whales
