Letter paid fresh breeze at 10 AM
 saw 1 whale, however, did not
 killed at 12, took him to the
 ship, saw 1 whale, the ship
 12 ships in sight & rolling

Winds NW Remarks on board Thursday Nov 6th
 Commences with fresh breeze
 at 1 AM commenced cutting
 at 4 finished and chased the
 ship, spoke the ship Chilli
 larger breeze, ship encountered
 at 12 AM light in sail and set

 at 5 AM called all hands
 and made sail commenced
 rolling calm

Letter paid calm, employed in
 looking for hump backs
 and this day 12 ships in sight
 & of them rolling
