Commenced with light air, all hands
employed in clearing the decks
all day, and moderate breeze
one ship in sight steering to
the N.W. by S
cross W. by S

all day light commenced
clearing tow at 4 M finished

Latter part light air, and the
fore top in air, steering sail and
red it coming to the end, then
day all hands employed in
washing ship, saw five backs

commenced with light air
finished washing of new fin back,
and new get to in the steering
sail, steering W. by S.

all day light 2 sail in sight

breeze, could not get fast
and end this day 3 sail in sight

Remarks on board Friday Nov 21st 1834

Commenced with light air
from the S.W. all hands employed
in ship duty at 5 AM saw a
whale, bowled and started, did not
fasten at dark took in sail

Middle part calm
all day light made sail

Latter part the same
all hands employed in ship duty
no end this day

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 22nd 1834

Commenced with pleasant breeze
at 4 AM saw a whale, bowled
and fast, and the last time bowled
steep, killed at 9 AM took
him to the ship and took
in sail



Middle part the same
all day light calms all at 5 PM
commenced cutting at 5 finished
and made sail

Latter part fine weather commenced
baling, no end this day
all hands employed in baling and
manning the topsails but
saw no sail
