Remarks on board Monday Dec 9th

Commenced with light air
one ship and one sloop in
sight near the harbor and a
whale and 5 or 6 men too
whale covered could not
get out and I was taken in
sail

Middle part calm
at day light made sail
the ship Mozambique in
sight

Latter part calm beyond the
fore part of each day
all hands employed in
mending the fore sail

Remarks on board Dec 10th 1834

Commenced with light air
and the fore sail was hoisted
the fore top sail got hoisted
employed in mending it
one ship in sight at 10 AM
one sloop cutting at 5 PM
but the fore top sail steering
S.W. at 1 PM and saw a whale
barn. could not get out
and I was taken in sail

Middle part moderate breeze
at day light made sail on 3 sail
in sight for sailing

Latter part fair weather and
10 AM saw a 2nd whale took
him too the ship and cut him in
commenced taking 10 days this day
4 sail in sight one sailing

Commenced with fair weather
steering for the S. & sail in
sight the water employed in fishing
barn, using whale gear, grubs to
winnow at 1 PM and took in
the gulland such and at the water

Middle part fresh breeze
double reefed the top sails
pushed sailing

Latter part fresh gales and foggy
10 ends this day 1 saw nothing

Remarks on board Thursday Dec 12th

Commenced with strong gales
and sailing at 8 PM, more moderate
and clear made sail
at 10 PM took in sail
5 ships in sight heading to the
off

at day light made sail
5 ships in sight 2 sailing
and one sitting

Latter part calm spoke the
ship Falcon of New Bedford
with 12 whales
all hands employed in stowing
down 19 ends this day
saw hump backs
