weeks 11 ends this day

Remarks on board Thursday Jan 4 1834

Commenced with strong gales  
and fog at 5 PM more  
moderate and clear more ship  
and headed to the S.W.  
red the fore and main sail  
jib and mizen top sail

Middle part the gale  
at day light red the fore  
top sail saw fin backs

Latter part fresh gales  
heaving to the S.W. under  
double reef top sail jib and  
main sail to end this day

Remarks on board Monday Jan 5 1834

Commenced with strong breezes  
at 3 PM saw two whales  
breezes got fresh and lost the  
line of sight again and  
parted at dusk took in sail

Middle part more moderate  
at day light main sail

Latter part strong breezes  
red the top sail  
employed in mending old  
clothes 11 ends this day  
saw nothing latter part
