Remarks on board Sunday Feb. 19th

Commences with calm and boat
in search for the road between
from the ship at 5 PM took
the windlass on board

Coming
Middle part calm

Letter part light air from the sea
got up the top gallant mast and
fly jill boom carpenter to work
in the mainmast so ends this
day

Remarks on board Tuesday Feb. 21st 1835

Commences with calm finish
no windlass
Shipst Spencer McDougall
and Augustus.

Middle part calm and foggy

Letter part light air and
sea at 11 AM heaved anchors
and stood for sea and
this day fine weather and calm

Remarks on board Saturday Feb. 21st 1835

Commences with pleasant breeze
standing to sea at 4 PM took the
anchors on to the bow and unhooked the
chains and stow. Then away
at 8 PM chased mackerel and brought
in some for the crew and the patients
Landing W.S.W.

Middle part strong breeze
doubly reefed the top sail
hoisted in the jill and main sail
at 2 PM more sail and headed in
for the land

Letter part the wind set the
main sail the patch employed
in repairing sails at 10 PM hauled
back the line 15 miles distance
