Latter part fresh breeze heaving S.E. by E the watch employed in breaking out between decks as ends this day

Wind S.E. Remarks on board Saturday March 14th

Commences with pleasant breeze set the flying sail course S.E. by E the watch employed in breaking out between decks at 6 the fresh breeze and squally took in staving sail and top gallant sail

Middle part strong breeze and squally took in the fore and main sail

Latter part the same unvent the main top gallant sail and mended it as ends this day
