

Ship Courier of Dorchester lying at  
 anchor in Augustine Bay Wilmet Luce Master

Remarks on board Friday 27 March 1835.

Commenced with fine weather  
 at 5 PM took the anchor and  
 lay up the bay the barque  
 George of Malacca arrived  
 with 304 lbs

Middle part moderate

Latter part fine weather  
 so could this day two boats  
 after noon and one after  
 a bullock &c

Remarks on board Saturday March 28th

Commenced with fresh breeze  
 and squalls of rain  
 employed in working &c

Middle part fine weather

Latter part calm and fine  
 weather two boats employed  
 in working the rest employed  
 clearing away cargo so ended this day  
 finished working

Remarks on board Sunday March 29th 1835.

Commenced with fresh breeze and  
 fine weather employed in working  
 away noon &c

Middle part strong breeze

M. L. W. Latter part the same  
 employed in working, no tying  
 one boat came on shore  
 on liberty &c ended this day

Remarks on board Monday March 30th

Commenced with fresh gale  
 and a heavy swell at 6 AM  
 let off the other anchor  
 and kept a purchase on the  
 chain

Middle part moderate

Latter part strong breeze  
 all hands employed in clearing  
 ship, out rig and other parts  
 of this duty &c ended this day
