Remarks on board Saturday April 4th 1851

Commenced with fine weather all hands employed in stowing off and clearing the decks

Middle part the same

Latter part fine weather took up the small anchor so ended this day and board in shore

Remarks on board Sunday April 5th
Commenced with fresh breezes arrived ship Metopie of Boston with 1200 lbs ship George of Nantucket with 450 lbs

Middle part light airs

Latter part fine weather at 4 AM weighed anchor and stood to sea in company with ship Bismarck of Providence and barque George of Martha's Vineyard at 11 AM the latter at anchor the others and returned them again after the anchors and this day saw the steam sailing ship Boston 15 miles

Remarks on board Monday April 6th

Commenced with fine weather and a fresh breeze heading to the S.W. at 6 PM took in sail and set the water

Middle part the same at day light made sail

Latter part light airs, the water employed in ship duty so ended this day 4 sail in sight

Remarks on board Tuesday April 7th
Wind S.E.
Commenced with pleasant breeze the water employed in ship duty at 4 PM took in sail

Middle part the same at day light made sail

Latter part calm the water employed in ship duty so ended this day 3 sail in sight
