 Winds S.S.E. Remarks on board Tues June 23^d 1851
 Commenced with fine weather
 according to the all hands
 employed in boiling and getting
 up shoofs at 6 AM took in
 sail and set the watch

Middle part moderate sun
 ship to the S.W. at 3 PM
 finished boiling
 at day light made all sail
 3 ships in sight

Latter part light air at 2 PM
 saw several whales (one dead) got
 fast to two & cut this day
 2 ships in sight calm
 killed the whales and went
 to towing

 Long of Ob 38 20

Winds S.W. Remarks on board Wed June 24th
 Commenced with calm weather
 boats of towing at sun set took
 the whales to the ship and
 took in sail

Middle part calm
 at day light commenced
 commenced cutting two sail in
 sight

Latter part light air at 10 AM
 finished cutting and made sail
 spoke ship James Monroe
 of Glasgow with 250 tons of sperm
 oil ship Ontario of Sag
 Harbour with 120 of sperm
 so end this day

Indian Ocean Wilmet Luce Master.
 Winds S.S.W. Remarks on board Thurs June 25th 1851
 Commenced with pleasant breeze
 all hand employed in boiling
 and clearing away head and
 clearing the decks saw the
 ship Ontario take a whale
 at 6 AM took in sail and
 set the watch heading to the
 W. boiling

Middle part strong breeze
 at day light set double reef
 top sail

Latter part the same
 all hands employed in getting
 up shoofs and boiling so
 ends this day ship James Monroe
 to windward

Winds S.W. Remarks on board Friday June 26th
 Commenced with fine weather
 at 10 AM all hands employed
 in boiling at 4 PM spoke the ship
 Ontario boiling at 6 took in
 sail and set the watch

Middle part fresh breeze
 at day light made sail

Latter part fresh breeze
 all hands employed in ship
 deck washing and getting up
 shoofs so ends this day
 ship Ontario in sight
