

Ship Courier of Dorchester Cruising in the Narraumbay

Winds & Remarks on board Thursday July 9th 1831

Commenced with fresh breezes both in the top gallant sails and 6th top in sail and set the watch heading to the S.E. one sail in sight

Middle part fine weather at 12 finishing taking and hoisted the Dicks and day light and the top sail & sail in sight

Latter part light airs and a heavy swell " and this day plenty of squalls

Lat of Ob 28.22

Long of Ob 39.09

Winds & Remarks on board Friday July 10th

Commenced with light air and squalls heading to the N.W. saw plenty of pump bushes at 6 AM and the watch took down

Middle part squally at day light made sail

Latter part fresh breezes saw whales lower got fast and killed " and this day

Lat of Ob 28.14

Long of Ob 33.47

Channel for whales Vincent Lowe Master D.C.

Winds & Remarks on board Saturday July 11th

Commenced with fine weather and a heavy sea at 1 PM took the school to the ship and commenced cutting at 5 PM finished and took in sail

Middle part the sun at day light and the top sails squared

Latter part fresh breezes commenced taking to end this day two ships in sight

Lat of Ob 27.50

Long of Ob 33.24

Winds & Remarks on board Sunday July 12th 1831

Commenced with fresh breezes two sail in sight saw a dead whale at 1 PM took down to the ship and commenced cutting at 10 PM finished the body and took in sail saw ship to the S. saw a ship yet a whale

Middle part strong gales the watch completely in charging the Dicks and securing the hulk took in the fore sail

Latter part strong gales at 10 PM took the dead along side and hoisted on at 12 fresh in the junk parted from anchor lost the way so ended this day one ship in sight cutting
