 hoisting from ship to the S
 at day light and double masts
 top sails

Latter part fresh breeze
 5 sail in sight
 at 11 PM spoke ship
 spoke with 150 lbs of sperm
 and our way to whale
 at end the day

 N.E. Commenced with fresh breeze
 5 sail in sight and 6 PM at the

 took up all night at day light
 set the fore sail

Latter part fresh gales came
 S.E. all hands employed in
 hoisting 10 sails this day

Remarks on board Thursday July 16th
 N.E. Commenced with fresh gales
 steering to the S.E.
 all hands employed in hoisting

Middle part more moderate
 kept to the wind and took
 in the fore sail brought hoisting
 at day light and the top sails

Latter part fresh breeze
 all hands employed in clearing
 the decks and the back
 Surge of water to the S.W.
 at end the day saw plenty of
 fin backs
