 squally course at 11 AM
 brought ship to the anchor

Middle part squally with in
 the top sails at day light and another
 squally breeze with and main
 sail heading S W

Latter part fresh breeze and squally
 now ship to the N on sail in sight
 at 8 PM saw two galleons
 got fast and brought at 11 AM
 brought her to the ship and commenced
 cutting so ended this day & saw
 now two galleons and ship steering
 to the S E

Wind Remarks on board Monday Sept 21st 1830

Commenced with strong breeze
 and a bad sea all hands employed
 in cutting at 3 PM finished and
 got dinner at 3 PM saw two
 galleons heading got fast and killed
 at 6 PM brought her to the ship
 and took in sail of the bark
 brought of 20 persons and 1 galleon
 that was on our ship to leeward
 saw two galleons of French
 bark in sight to leeward

Middle part fresh gale all hands
 employed in clearing the decks and
 fitting boats heading N W with
 a small aboy side

S W S W

Latter part fresh gale now ship
 and commenced cutting a heavy sea
 one ship in sight cutting at
 11 PM finished cutting and made sail
 had the sea brought up tips so
 ended this day saw no more
 heading N W S W
