over the bows covering the ship

watch employed in washing ship
and other job of ship duty
as end this day course W. N. W.

Remarks on board Wed. Sept 30th

S. E.

Commences with strong breeze
course W. N. W. the watch employed
in ship duty saw a ship bearing
to the S. and a brig steering
to the N. W. at 6.15 the watch
in gill sail and left to the wind
bearing S. W.

Middle part fresh gale

Latter part strong gales with
squalls at 4 AM and the fore top
sail shot up and broke off at
9 AM but a man with
board in throwing up the mainmast
lowered a boat and picked them
up shore and towed the boat in
trying to hoist her up took in
the fore top sail and left to
the wind as end this day
bearing S. W.
