 heading S. E. W.

Latter part the same steering
 to the W. N. W. ship James
 in company and up the
 fore and main top gallant
 masts so ended day saw
 for back

S. E. Commenced with light air
 heading to the S. E. in company
 with ship James at noon
 up the fore and main

 both in sight and now ship to the
 S. E. W. alone

S. E. Middle part the same
 at day light made all sail

Latter part pleasant breeze steering
 to the S. E. the gentlest wind yet
 in ship but so ended this day
 ship James in sight saw for
 back

 W. N. W. Commenced with fresh breeze
 steering to the S. E. at
 4 P.M. both in sight heading
 S.

Middle part the same
 at day light made all sail

 to the S. E. at 8 P.M. saw a
 gun of war at 9 P.M. which was
 given to us and we were
 not far off. at noon this day
 in place in company the
 ship James in sight
