 Wind S.W. Remarks on board Sunday Oct 11th 1835

Commenced with strong
 breeze steering to the
 S.E. at 2 PM saw
 whales some could
 not get but saw plenty
 of whales going quick
 to the surface
 at 4 PM took in full
 heading S.W. ship James
 in company
 at 10 hours shot the 1st

Middle part fine weather
 at day light made
 all sail

Latter part fine weather
 men shot the 1st
 at 9 AM shot the 2nd
 shot the 3rd with 50 shot
 from our ship James
 the 4th chasing whales
 kept off to end this day
 5 sail in sight

Wind S.W. Remarks on board Saturday 10th
 Commenced with fine weather
 steering to the S. at 4 PM
 spoke ship Chili with 1000
 of whale 50 sperm barrels
 many of 1st Johns with
 2100 of whale and 100 of sperm
 at 6 PM took in sail
 for a gun see

Middle part calm
 at day light made all
 sail

Latter part light air
 steering to the S. sail
 in sight to end this
 day fine weather and nothing
 to do

South Atlantic Ocean Wilmet Luce Master
 Wind S.W. Remarks on board Sunday Oct 11th 1835

Commenced with calm 1/2 sail
 in sight any no whales
 at 6 PM took in 1st galled
 sail 1st and main sail
 light air course S.E.

Middle part 1/2 sail
 at day light all sail

Latter part pleasant breeze
 and steady to end this day
 nothing in sight steering to the
 S.

Wind S.W. Remarks on board Monday Oct 12th 1835
 Commenced with 1st breeze
 steering to the S. nothing in sight
 at 6 PM took in all sail
 and kept for 1/2 sail S.W.
 plenty of birds and green
 water appearing to see whales
 in the morning

Middle part strong breeze
 at day light 1st sail
 and 1st sail at 6 PM took them
 in again

Latter part strong gales and
 squally very much to the S.
 to end this day no whales
