 the men, and at 8 AM saw
 a whale however could not
 get fast at 5 PM wind shifted
 in a squall and 4 PM both
 in sail leaving S. & E.

 at day light made all sail
 heading to the S. & two sail in sight

Latter part fine weather but
 8 AM started ship to the N.
 saw a sun fish, however got
 fast and drove it and this day
 the watch employed in making
 long shunt gun back ship to
 the S. & E.

 Winds S.W. Remarks on board Sunday Nov 8th 1851
 Commenced with fine weather
 steering to the S. & saw a whale
 but could not get fast at 5 PM
 saw another however could not
 get fast at 4 PM both in sail
 three sail in sight

Middle part the same
 at day light made sail
 & still in sight

Latter part fresh breeze, between
 ship, Martha of Fair Haven
 with 3 masts ship, Com Perry
 with 4 masts, & ended this day
 plenty of pin backs

 Long by Obs 10.28

Winds S.W. Remarks on board Monday Nov 9th 1851
 Commenced with fresh breeze
 steering to the S. & E. saw three
 whales at 4 PM both in sail

Middle part moderate
 at day light made all sail

Latter part fresh breeze
 steering to the S. the watch
 employed in making gun
 jump, & ended this day
 ship, Martha in sight
