6 PM lowered and fast and killed
at 8 PM took him to the
ship and took in sail calm

at day light commenced
cutting

Latter part light air at 9 AM
finished cutting and made sail
heading to the S.W. at 11 PM
took out to the N 2 ship
in sight on sailing
